Extended Response Questions. Answers may include the following

- 1. Answer should include credentialing is the process one has achieved the required academic degree(s) and license/certification to practice. Certification is not the same as licensure. Unlike licensure, certification is typically a voluntary process where a credential is provided by a non-government organization. The certifying body provides public protection for those professionals who have successfully met all stated requirements for the credential and demonstrated professional competency in their duties as established by the profession. Requirements for certification vary depending on the type of certification, if it is a national or state certification, and where one intends to practice. Licensure is legal authority granted by state statute to practice a profession within a defined scope of practice and licensure laws are established "to protect the public by establishing minimum standards of preparation and ensuring the professional is qualified to perform the duties defined in the scope of practice"
